



**LIMITED DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE
SPECIFIC ORDINANCES
OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER**

Pursuant to the power vested in the Executive Director of the Department of Public Safety by Section 2.6.3 of the Charter of the City and County of Denver and subject to the Specifications of Authority hereinafter described, deputies of the Colorado State Patrol (“CSP”) are hereby commissioned to enforce specific ordinances of the City:

SPECIFICATION OF AUTHORITY


Deputies of the Colorado State Patrol are hereby commissioned to enforce specific ordinances of the City and are authorized and empowered to enforce specific provisions of the Denver Revised Municipal Code (DRMC) only in the manner specified as follows:

1. Commissioned troopers of the Colorado State Patrol are hereby authorized and empowered to issue citations for violations of the following sections of the DRMC:
 - a. 38-115 Trespass
 - b. 38-89 Disturbing the peace
 - c. 38-93 Assault
 - d. 38-93.1 Public fighting
 - e. 38-99 Urinating or defecating in public
 - f. 38-51.8 Petty theft
 - g. 38-61 Destruction of Public Property
 - h. 38-71 Destruction of Private Property
 - i. 38.-86 Obstruction of streets or other public passageways
 - j. 38-102 Possession of graffiti materials prohibited
 - k. 38-117 Dangerous or deadly weapons
 - l. 38-119 Certain knives unlawful
 - m. 38-125 Obstruction equipment prohibited
 - n. 38-126 Incendiary or explosive devices
 - o. 38-127 Throwing stones or missiles
 - p. 38-130 Assault weapons
 - q. 39-3 Park curfews and closures
 - r. 39-6 Destruction of park property
 - s. 57-24 Damaging trees on public property
 - t. 57-26 Unauthorized use of trees on public property

2. This authority is confined to the locations as specified herein:
 - a. The property surrounding the Colorado State Capitol located at 200 E. Colfax Avenue in Denver, Colorado, including surrounding parks, Veteran's/Lincoln Park, adjacent sidewalks, parking lots, and adjacent public rights-of-way.
 - b. The Governor's Mansion, also known as the Cheesman-Boettcher Mansion, located at 400 E. 8th Avenue in Denver, Colorado, including adjacent Governor's Park, the surrounding adjacent sidewalks, and adjacent public rights-of-way.
3. Before exercising authority under this delegation, commissioned CSP troopers must coordinate significant or planned enforcement decisions and actions with the Denver Department of Safety.
4. Before exercising authority under this delegation, each CSP trooper must be individually and specifically commissioned, and such commission shall only be granted after the deputy has completed mandatory training from the Denver City Attorney's Office and the Department of Safety. Commissioned CSP troopers must comply with the provisions of the Law Enforcement Integrity Act. Failure to do so will result in immediate revocation of the commission.

It is understood that the commissions granted pursuant to this delegation of authority are without pay and expire when employment requiring appointment terminates, and exist at the pleasure of the Executive Director of the Department of Public Safety, who reserves the right in his/her sole discretion to revoke said commissions if he/she feels that revocation serves the best interests of the City and County of Denver or the general public.

This delegation of authority is effective immediately, and will continue as a pilot program for three months, expiring on October 22, 2020, unless extended, rescinded, superseded, or amended in writing by the Executive Director of the Denver Department of Safety.
