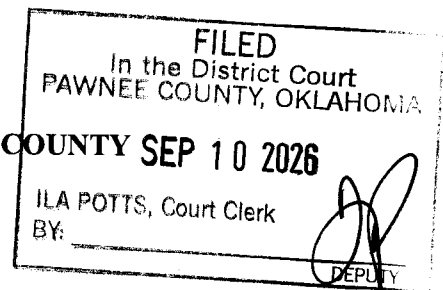

AFFIDAVIT

The undersigned, of lawful age, being first duly sworn, upon oath, deposes and states as follows: ETHAN PIXLER is a Special Agent with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, and has read certain official investigative reports and statements of witnesses and/or interviewed witnesses and/or communicated with other peace officers regarding the above-named defendant(s) and from these statements, reports, and your affiant's own observation and knowledge, it appears as follows:

On June 15, 2026 District Attorney MIKE FISHER of the Pawnee County District Attorney's Office requested OSBI investigative assistance with an official misconduct investigation. The incident involved the Chief of the Jennings, Oklahoma Police Department and did occur at the Jennings city dog pound on 5th St, Jennings, Pawnee County, Oklahoma while on duty. The case was assigned to OSBI Special Agent ETHAN PIXLER.

WHAT WITNESS(ES) OBSERVED:

Victim **GABRIELLE RENEE WAKLEY** can testify to the following:

WAKLEY was the owner of three-year-old female Blue Heeler "YANKEE" for about six months. WAKLEY was the owner of four-month-old female Blue Heeler "BABE" for about two weeks. YANKEE was the mother of BABE.

On June 15, 2026, at about 0730 hours, WAKLEY put YANKEE and BABE in her fenced-in front yard and left home for a medical appointment. YANKEE had figured out how to nudge the bottom of the fence up enough to slide through but did not usually escape. At about 1200 hours, WAKLEY returned home and did not see either dog in the yard and the gate was secure and closed.

WAKLEY went to Jennings City Hall to ask the city clerk if the dogs had been found and was told no. WAKLEY saw Jennings Police Chief JASON BRADLEY, who yelled at her for receiving tickets for her dogs and not keeping them in her yard. WAKLEY had never been warned or cited by the Jennings Police Department for her dogs. She asked BRADLEY if he had seen her dogs and he said no. She showed BRADLEY a picture of YANKEE and BABE and BRADLEY said he had not seen them.

WAKLEY walked around Jennings looking for her dogs for several hours and no one had seen them. She asked her neighbor across the street, CHRISTINE DOWNEY. DOWNEY told her BRADLEY was over earlier that morning with them but had not seen them since.

WAKLEY posted a missing poster on a community Facebook page and saw comments that PAUL TAULMAN killed her dogs. Jennings city maintenance employee STRKYER STANLEY called WAKLEY'S fiancé, CLARK GATWOOD, and told him STANLEY had to bury their dogs at BRADLEY'S request. GATWOOD and STANLEY dug up YANKEE and BABE from the pound and buried them in WAKLEY'S yard. WAKLEY took pictures of YANKEE and BABE prior to burial to document injuries she believed to be gunshots to their head near their ears.

Later that evening, BRADLEY called GATWOOD and WAKLEY and said their dogs were sweet but "had to be dealt with". BRADLEY told WAKLEY he knew he had killed her dogs when they spoke earlier in the day, but didn't tell her as he "had to go to Tulsa."

Witness CASEY ARDELL MUSE can testify to the following:

MUSE was the Mayor of Jennings, Oklahoma and had served in that capacity since January 2026. On June 15, 2026 MUSE was notified that two dogs belonging to a citizen had been on the property of PAUL TAULMAN, chasing his cattle. TAULMAN told MUSE that the dogs had never been in his back yard, but were located in a live trap on his property. TAULMAN told MUSE that Jennings Police Chief JASON BRADLEY drove by and followed the dogs on foot with his pistol in hand towards the owner's house, then put them in a pen in the fenced front yard.

MUSE was told by public works employee JOSEPH WRIGHT that BRADLEY had transported two dogs to the pound and killed them. BRADLEY asked WRIGHT to help bury the dogs and MUSE approved WRIGHT to help. Later that day, GABRIELLE WAKLEY came to the Jennings Police Department asking about the location of the dogs; BRADLEY did not tell WAKLEY that he had located or killed them.

WAKLEY told MUSE she read on Facebook that her missing dogs had been killed by TAULMAN. MUSE believed that WAKLEY was the owner of the dogs BRADLEY had killed. Later that evening, MUSE asked BRADLEY about WAKLEY'S dogs and BRADLEY said, "I handled it."

WHAT OFFICER(S) OBSERVED AND/OR DID:

Witness ETHAN PIXLER, OSBI Special Agent, will testify to the following:

On June 30, 2026 at approximately 1115 hours PIXLER spoke with JASON TROY BRADLEY at his residence located at 160 S Salt Creek Dr in Mannford, Creek County, Oklahoma. BRADLEY was the Chief of Police of the Jennings Police Department and had held the position since 2024. BRADLEY was also a reserve deputy with the Pawnee County Sheriff's Office.

On June 15, 2026 BRADLEY was notified that some dogs were out and PAUL TAULMAN had one in a trap. TAULMAN let the gray cattle dog out and BRADLEY drove his police vehicle behind it to an address on 7th Street in Jennings and shut the gate behind the dog. BRADLEY resumed patrol and later saw the gray cattle dog outside and returned it to the fenced yard, knocking on the side of the trailer but no one answered.

BRADLEY later returned and saw two gray cattle dogs outside the fenced yard and loaded them into his Jennings police vehicle, and did not attempt to locate the dogs' owner. BRADLEY took the dogs to the Jennings pound and shot each dog with his duty pistol near the back of the head. BRADLEY instructed public works employees to bury the dogs.

BRADLEY encountered WAKLEY at the Jennings City Hall and told her to put her dogs away, but did not tell her that he had killed the dogs. BRADLEY willfully caused the captive dogs belonging to WAKLEY to be killed.

THE OFFENSE(S) OCCURRED IN PAWNEE COUNTY, OKLAHOMA

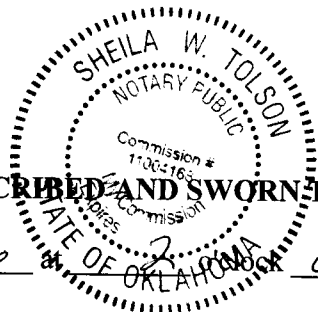

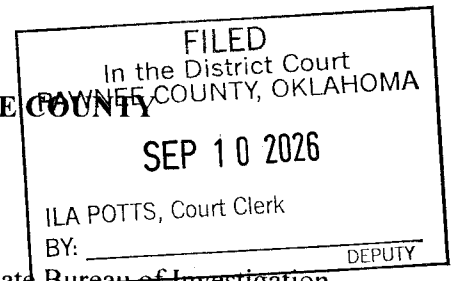

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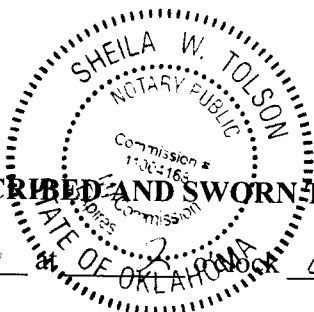
