SEVERE WEATHER PLAN

SAFETY PLAN

Have a meeting with your family, staff or group to discuss your plan ahead of the storm.

Stay calm – Children and others look to their parents and leaders to know how to act.

Locate your safe place – A shelter or inner room that puts two sets of walls between you and outside.

Put together your survival kit and store in your safe place.

Conduct a weather safety drill.

WARNING AND WATCHES: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

WARNING

It **IS** happening!
Seek shelter immediately.

Tornado:

Detected by National Weather Service radar or sighted by a trained storm spotter.

Severe Thunderstorm:

Winds detected of at least 58 mph and/or hail of one inch in diameter.

WATCH

It **MIGHT** happen.
Prepare yourself and your family.

Tornado:

Conditions are favorable for the development of tornadoes.

Severe Thunderstorm:

Conditions are favorable for severe thunderstorms.
