CASE SYNOPSIS

On Tuesday 08/26/2025 at approximately 1500 hours, I was advised to investigate a complaint received from Tempe Commander Rashidi Johnson (retired). The complaint alleges misuse of the Arizona Criminal Justice Information System (ACJIS) by Tempe PD personnel, at the direction of City Manager Rosa Inchausti.

I was tasked with reviewing the complaint to determine if a crime occurred.

This investigation will be documented in additional supplemental reports.

CASE ASSIGNMENT/ NOTIFICATION

On Tuesday 08/26/2025 at approximately 1410 hours, I attended a meeting with Peoria Police Chief T. Intrieri, Deputy Chief D. Steele, Lieutenant C. Webb, Sergeant M. Miller, and Detective R. Angulo. During this meeting, I was assigned as the Case Agent for a criminal investigation into alleged Arizona Criminal Justice Information System (ACJIS) violations involving the City of Tempe and Tempe Police Department. The complaint was forwarded to the Peoria Police Department by the Arizona Department of Public Safety (DPS) due to a perceived conflict of interest. The investigation is narrowly focused on the ACJIS violation allegations. I was advised there are also civil rights and witness tampering claims that have been referred to the Arizona Attorney General's Office for their review.

ALLEGATIONS

The allegations stem from a letter dated August 6, 2025, authored by Attorney Lawrence Henke on behalf of Retired Tempe Police Commander Rashidi Johnson. Henke's letter was sent to DPS Lt. Col. Jesse Galvez and details unauthorized access, dissemination, and political misuse of ACJIS data by Tempe City Manager Rosa Inchausti and Tempe Police personnel. Specific claims include:

- The creation of a specialized tracking system/report using ACJIS and criminal history information to monitor homeless advocates Austin Davis and Ron Tapscott, allegedly at Inchausti's direction
- Involvement of IT employees Stephanie Deitrick and Waddell Holmes in developing the system
- The display and discussion of ACJIS sensitive information during quarterly meetings attended by unauthorized individuals, such as Deputy City Manager Greg Ruiz.

NEWS ARTICLE

Chief Intrieri forwarded me an ABC 15 news article related to this investigation. The article was posted on 08/15/2025 and was titled, Former Tempe cop accuses city of misusing police data to track homeless advocates. The article discussed the letter written by Attorney Lawrence Henke that was sent to DPS outlying the accusations. Included in the news article were responses ABC 15 news received from various Tempe Police and City officials. The following are those responses:

Assistant Chief Dane Sorensen Response:

I have never shared ACJIS information with anyone who is not authorized – ever. I have not been requested to provide ACJIS information to City Manager Rosa Inchausti, nor have I given it to her – or any unauthorized person. Regarding the text addressing Papago Park: at the time, the park was a concern for the city due to crime occurring in and around it. It is the responsibility of Tempe Police to address crime and do criminal justice work to keep our city safe. That is exactly what we did.

This letter is nothing but a malicious attempt to smear Tempe Police Department and the outstanding officers who work here.

Chief Deputy City Manager Greg Ruiz's Response:

I've led community health and safety efforts in Tempe for more than 30 years. Protecting people's personal information is critical to anyone involved in healthcare or public safety. This letter boldly accuses me of breaking my longstanding ethical and professional standards. These allegations are ridiculous, offensive and complete lies.

1. Are you authorized to access AJCIS information?

As the Chief Deputy City Manager charged with overseeing the Tempe Police Department, I have been authorized to receive AJCIS information, as I was when I was Tempe Fire Chief. With that said, I have never requested or received AJCIS information regarding any single individual -- including Austin Davis and/or Ron Tapscott -- or ACJIS information on the unsheltered community. In sum, these accusations are lies.

2. Did you have a standing meeting with PD where they provided ACJIS information? If so, can you explain the justification?

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NARRATIVE (continuation)

As the Chief Deputy City Manager charged with managing the Tempe Police Department, I have a number of standing meetings with Chief McCoy and members of his team. None of these meetings include the presentation of AJCIS information, and none of these meetings include specific information targeting Davis, Tapscott or the unhoused community in Tempe. Again, that accusation is completely false.

3. Did Rosa request that the police department begin gathering data on the homeless, as far as you know?

No, she did not request such information, nor was such information provided to her or to me. This accusation, like every other accusation in Mr. Henke's letter, is a defamatory fantasy.

4. Is it true (as stated above) that you and Rosa received ACJIS data on homeless people?

No, we did not receive AJCIS information regarding the city's homeless population. Nor did we request it -- ever. That's a lie.

Chief McCoy's Response:

The claims in Mr. Henke's letter are categorically false, defamatory, and wholly unsupported by facts. At no time have I, nor any member of the Tempe Police Department under my direction, provided ACJIS or any other law enforcement-sensitive information to the City Manager, Deputy City Manager, or any unauthorized individual for political purposes or selective enforcement. To state otherwise is not only baseless, but also a reckless distortion that undermines the integrity of public safety professionals across this state.

Mr. Henke's narrative includes outrageous fabrications and misleading assertions regarding the operations of the Tempe Police Department and the conduct of City leadership. The allegations that our department has engaged in unlawful tracking, misuse of confidential information, or the politicization of police resources are offensive, unfounded, and in direct contradiction to our agency's policies, oversight mechanisms, and long-standing commitment to ethical policing.

The suggestion that I "systematized" the disclosure of ACJIS information is not only false, but also a malicious attempt to tarnish my character and that of the dedicated men and women I serve alongside. Like all complex organizations, we continuously evaluate and strengthen our practices related to the use and protection of sensitive law enforcement data.

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NARRATIVE (continuation)

For more than 30 years, I have served with integrity, honor, and a steadfast commitment to the law. As Chief of Police, I will not allow false accusations to stand unchallenged, especially those that malign the professionalism of our department and suggest impropriety where none exists.

City Manager Rosa Inchausti's Response:

Thank you for reaching out, TJ. Let me be as clear as I can about the highly defamatory, lie-filled letter you received from Mr. Henke. I have never requested, nor have I ever received, information regarding Austin Davis or Ron Tapscott from an ACJIS database. There is "no campaign of harassment" against Davis, Tapscott, or any Tempe resident – full stop. Any allegation to the contrary is a flat-out lie.

1. Are you authorized to access AJCIS information?

No, I am not authorized to access AJCIS information independently. I have never requested ACJIS information.

2. Did you receive AJCIS information from Tempe PD? If so, what was the nature of that information?

I have never requested AJCIS data, nor have I received AJCIS data.

3. Did you ask the police department to start tracking data on homeless people in AJCIS?

No, never. Did you receive any pushback? Again, no. Like virtually every city in the nation, the City of Tempe uses anonymized data to guide and enhance how we provide millions of dollars in services to people in need, including the unhoused community -- like, for example, the Point-In-Time Homeless Count we conduct twice a year. We also provide a range of statistics regarding the unhoused community to the public via dashboards that have existed for years, like this one:

The City is not now, nor have we ever, engaged in illegal activity by "monitoring unhoused people in the parks." Again, neither myself nor Chief Deputy City Manager Greg Ruiz ever requested or demanded data from AJCIS – and we certainly did not order TPD personnel to engage in a "discriminatory" policy of "police tracking of a demographic simply based on their homeless status." Again, let me be clear: Every accusation contained in this letter, apparently sent by an attorney busy threatening to sue the City of Tempe on additional trumped-up allegations, is absolutely, unequivocally false.

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ARIZONA ATTORNEY GENERAL

On Thursday 09/23/2025 Sergeant Miller contacted the Arizona Attorney General Office and spoke to Supervising Special Agent Annalisa Madsen of the Criminal Division. Supervising Special Agent Madsen confirmed they received this allegation and said they are not investigating this as a crime. She also advised this allegation was forwarded to their civil rights section.

TEMPE POLICE

On Wednesday 10/08/2025, Sergeant Miller sent an email to Tempe Police Lieutenant Duran advising them of our investigation and asking for their cooperation. The email said:

“Hello Lieutenant Duran,

I am Matt Miller, the Major Crimes Sergeant here at Peoria. We have been asked to handle an investigation on potential ACJIS / Criminal History information dissemination violations regarding the attached complaint forwarded to me by DPS. I’m sure you’re familiar with the allegations.

The attached complaint has both a complaint to the Attorney General’s Officer, as well as a complaint to DPS regarding ACJIS violations. We have been asked to narrowly handle the ACJIS violation allegations sent to DPS due to a perceived conflict of DPS current Kernel being former Tempe. The complaint we will focus on is contained the first five pages of the attached document.

I am hoping you, or someone you can assign, is able to work with my lead investigator, Detective Michael Wadsworth (copied) (Det. Rene Angulo, Wadsworth’s partner, is also copied).

For Tempe’s part, we would like to know if we can receive cooperation in obtaining the following.

1. A copy of the alleged report constructed for the City Manager allegedly obtained from accessing ACJIS and/or criminal justice history information in an effort to track Austin David and/or Ron Tapscott.
 - a. Information on what databases are accessed by the alleged report.
 - b. Interview the employees in IT who were allegedly assigned to make this report. (Stephanie Deitrick and Waddel Holmes)
2. In regards to the allegation of a quarterly meeting where ACJIS information was displayed in the presence of unauthorized persons, I would ask.

- a. Is there a quarterly meeting where operations, statistics, etc... are spoken about?
- b. Is restricted criminal justice record information and/or ACJIS information spoken about and/or displayed at these meeting?
- c. Who attends such meetings, and is a roster kept?
- d. Does the City Manager and/or Deputy City Manager attend such meetings?
 - i. If so, are the CM and/or DCM who attend properly backgrounded and authorized to view ACJIS information?

On Friday 11/21/2025, Lieutenant Duran emailed the following response:

“Sergeant Miller, Detective Wadsworth, and Detective Angulo:

Thank you for reaching out related to your investigation into allegations of ACJIS violations on behalf of the Arizona Department of Public Safety. The Tempe Police Department is committed to full transparency and willing to assist in any way necessary to support the investigation.

In response to the areas of information you identified in your email dated October 8, 2025, please see the following:

1. A copy of the alleged report constructed by the City Manager allegedly obtained from accessing ACJIS and/or criminal justice history information in an effort to track Austin Davis and/or Ron Tapscott.

The Tempe Police Department did not create or compile, and is unaware of the existence of, any report constructed by or provided to the City Manager that includes ACJIS and/or criminal justice history information related to Austin Davis and/or Ron Tapscott.

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a. Information on what databases are accessed by the alleged report.

See above answer.

b. Interview the employees in IT who were allegedly assigned to make this report (Stephanie Deitrick and Waddel Holmes).

As Ms. Deitrick and Holmes are not Tempe Police Department employees, the Tempe City Attorney's Office will be handling the request for their interviews. Please contact Eric Anderson, City Attorney, at 480-350-8227 or Eric_Anderson@tempe.gov to further discuss this request.

2. In regards to the allegation of a quarterly meeting where ACJIS information was displayed in the presence of unauthorized persons, I would ask:

a. Is there a quarterly meeting where operations, statistics, etc... are spoken about?

Yes, the Quarterly Command Report Out highlights the work and accomplishments of key departmental groups, including Field Operations, Traffic, Investigations, Police Analytics, Personnel Services, and Community Engagement. Its purpose is to keep command staff informed and enhance collaboration across all divisions within the department.

b. Is restricted criminal justice record information and/or ACJIS information spoken about and/or displayed at these meetings?

No. Please see Attachment A, which is included as an example of one of the presentations that was created and used during a Quarterly Command Report Out meeting.

c. Who attends such meetings, and is a roster kept?

The Quarterly Command Report Out is attended by the Tempe Police Department's Command Staff, in addition to the City Manager, Interim Chief Deputy City Manager, and designated individuals who present on specific operational areas of the Department. No roster of attendance is kept for each

meeting; however, the calendar events and agendas for the following meeting dates are attached as Attachment B: December 6, 2023; March 13, 2024; June 5, 2024; September 4, 2024; and December 4, 2024.

d. Does the City Manager and/or Deputy City Manager attend such meetings?

Yes, the City Manager and/or Deputy City Manager routinely attend the Quarterly Report Out meetings.

i. If so, are the CM and/or DCM who attend properly backgrounded and authorized to view ACJIS information?

No ACJIS information is included during the Quarterly Command Report Out meeting, so attendees are not required to be authorized to view ACJIS information to attend. Neither the City Manager nor Interim Chief Deputy City Manager currently possess a Terminal Operator Certification (TOC), which is the certification required for individuals to access Criminal Justice Information when unescorted. Greg Ruiz, Interim Chief Deputy City Manager, is authorized by the Arizona Department of Public Safety to receive CJIS information as the representative of a Non-Criminal Justice Agency in his position as the Fire Chief for the City of Tempe. Please see Attachment C related to this authorization.

I reviewed the attachments and confirmed there was no confidential or ACJIS information contained.

CITY OF TEMPE

On Tuesday 12/16/2025, I emailed Tempe City Attorney Eric Anderson and requested to interview the two City of Tempe IT employees (Stephanie Deitrick and Waddel Holmes) listed in the complaint.

Ultimately, these interviews were scheduled for Wednesday 01/14/2026.

On 01/14/2026 at approximately 1530 hours, Detective Angulo and I responded to the Tempe City Attorney's office and spoke with Wydell Holmes and Stephanie Dietrick about these accusations. Our conversations were audio recorded and uploaded to Evidence.com. The following is a summary of our conversations but refer to the recording for exact statements. It should be noted that Tempe City Attorney Eric Anderson was also present during these interviews.

INTERVIEW OF WYDELL HOLMES

Holmes told me she does not work in IT and in fact, she is the Director of Strategic Management and Innovation. Holmes stated her understanding of the allegations was that a letter from an attorney representing a former employee claimed she and others accessed unauthorized ACJIS data and tracked residents regarding their activities at parks and community meetings.

Holmes denied creating any systems for tracking individuals or accessing ACJIS platforms. She clarified that her work involved advising on data fields for aggregate, anonymized reporting related to homelessness services, not individual identification. She explicitly stated, "I have no platform login or anything to even be able to do that" regarding ACJIS data. She further explained that any ACJIS data she encountered was generic metadata, not specific personal information. The intent for all data collection related to homelessness was for community-level anonymized reporting, not individual identification.

INTERVIEW OF STEPHANIE DIETRICH

Dietrich told me she does not work in IT and in fact, she is the Chief Data Analytics Officer. Dietrich confirmed she is ACJIS certified and has undergone a full police department background check, including fingerprints.

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Regarding the allegation of creating a "system" to track individuals and share ACJIS data, Dietrich clarified that the "system" likely refers to the existing police Records Management System (RMS), VersaTerm, which is a vendor-provided solution. She denied creating any external system to tap into or share ACJIS data, stating, "No, that's like we pay a vendor a whole lot of money for that." Dietrich explained that any data leaving the police department for external access is not ACJIS data and undergoes multiple layers of review by the police department, her team, and legal counsel to ensure anonymization. Public-facing data is anonymized, preventing the identification of specific individuals. She explicitly denied that the city manager or deputy city manager ever requested her to create a system to track people.

CONCLUSION

This investigation examined allegations of unauthorized access, dissemination, and political misuse of Arizona Criminal Justice Information System (ACJIS) data by City of Tempe and Tempe Police Department personnel. The claims, outlined in Attorney Lawrence Henke's letter to DPS, included:

- Creation of a tracking system/report using ACJIS/criminal history data to monitor homeless advocates Austin Davis and Ron Tapscott, allegedly directed by City Manager Rosa Inchausti.
- Involvement of City employees Stephanie Deitrick and Wydell Holmes in developing the system.
- Display or discussion of ACJIS sensitive information in quarterly Command Report-Out meetings attended by unauthorized persons, such as Deputy City Manager Greg Ruiz.

I conducted extensive follow-up which included:

- Review of the Henke letter
- Review of the ABC 15 news coverage containing the Tempe official responses
- Confirmation from the Arizona Attorney General's Office that related complaints were forwarded to their Civil Rights unit with no criminal investigation pursued.
- Tempe PD denied these accusations and provided samples of the reports and quarterly meeting minutes.
- In-person interviews with Wydell Holmes and Stephanie Deitrick. They both denied creating tracking systems for individuals, accessing/sharing ACJIS improperly, or receiving related requests from City leadership.

There is no evidence to support these allegations; therefore, they are unfounded. If new credible evidence is discovered in the future, this case can be reopened at that time.

ARIZONA CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM (ACJIS)

On Monday, 02/09/2026, at approximately 1541 hours, I requested the Arizona Criminal Justice Information System (ACJIS) inquiry history for the two named community activists, Austin Davis and Ron Tapscott, as well as Retired Tempe Police Commander Rashidi Johnson for the time period of 01/01/2023 through 01/01/2025 (the time frame of this allegation).

On Wednesday, 02/11/2026, at approximately 1259 hours, I received the requested information. I conducted a detailed examination of the provided ACJIS query logs. I specifically searched for any patterns that might indicate automated system queries, such as consistent time-of-day intervals or recurring runs on the same day of the month. After a thorough analysis, I did not observe any suspicious inquiries or any evidence consistent with the subjects being run by an automated system. All of the inquiries appear consistent with manual officer-initiated checks.

Additionally, neither City of Tempe employee Stephanie Deitrick nor Wydell Holmes appeared on the ACJIS inquiry return log as having accessed or queried either subject. There was no evidence in the ACJIS records to support their alleged involvement in creating any tracking system or improperly accessing criminal history information related to Austin Davis or Ron Tapscott.

ACJIS Inquiry Findings:

Austin Davis was queried 48 times by 39 different users during the requested timeframe.
Ron Tapscott was queried 5 times by 2 different users during the requested timeframe.
Rashidi Johnson was not queried at all during the requested timeframe.

I have also prepared a detailed document listing the last name of each user who queried Austin Davis, along with the exact date and time of each inquiry. This document was uploaded to Evidence.com.

CONCLUSION

This investigation examined allegations of unauthorized access, dissemination, and political misuse of Arizona Criminal Justice Information System (ACJIS) data by City of Tempe and Tempe Police Department personnel. The claims, outlined in Attorney Lawrence Henke's letter to DPS, included:

I conducted extensive follow-up which included:

- Review of the Henke letter.
- Review of the ABC 15 news coverage containing the Tempe official responses.
- Confirmation from the Arizona Attorney General's Office that related complaints were forwarded to their Civil Rights unit with no criminal investigation pursued.
- Tempe PD denied these accusations and provided samples of the reports and quarterly meeting minutes.
- In-person interviews with Wydell Holmes and Stephanie Deitrick. They both denied creating tracking systems for individuals, accessing/sharing ACJIS improperly, or receiving related requests from City leadership.
- A comprehensive review of ACJIS inquiry logs for Austin Davis, Ron Tapscott, and Rashidi Johnson covering the period of January 1, 2023, through January 1, 2025, specifically checking for any evidence of misuse or automated system activity.

After a detailed analysis of the ACJIS logs, no suspicious inquiries or evidence of automated system runs were identified. There is no evidence to support the allegations of unauthorized access, dissemination, or political misuse of ACJIS data. Therefore, the allegations are unfounded. If new credible evidence is discovered in the future, this case can be reopened at that time.

The case status is: Closed / Unfounded.

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
