What you need to know:

- November 13, 2021 or the March 26, 2022 Election
- St. Landry Parish School Millage ranks 64 out of 69 school districts in Louisiana, one of the lowest millage rates in Louisiana.
- St. Landry Parish last bond proposition was in 1986
- Two propositions
 - Salaries 9.98 mills; Proposed Salary Increase -Teachers (\$3,000); Support Personnel (\$2,000)
 - Athletic Facilities Improvements (Tracks) 1 mill
- Millage Proposal #1 (Salaries) Generate \$6,557,551 annually over ten years
- Millage Proposal #2 (Athletic Facilities) Generates \$662,379 annually; \$6.62 million over 10 years.

Millage Rates

Of the 69 school districts (excluding the Recovery School District), St. Landry Parish ranks 64th in

millage rates*.

- 20.52 mills (currently)
 - ♦ Salary Tax 11.78 mills
 - Constitution Tax 4.37 mills
 - Maintenance Tax 4.37 mills
- Average millage rate in Louisiana is 45 mills
- ♦ Lowest millage rate in Louisiana is 9.14 mills
- ♦ Highest millage rate in Louisiana is 78.26 mills

*St. Helena Parish had the lowest Millage rate and academic performance. They recently increased their millage rate, and academic performance has gradually increased since the millage increase.




Revenues By Source

A Closer Look

- Supplement Child Nutrition program annually from \$450,000 to \$1,200,000
- Maintained annual salary step increases for employees
- Beginning teacher salary has increased from \$25,692 in 2000 to 39,000 currently
- Increased costs in transportation, maintenance, and operations
- Pre-K Program with limited grant funding and no MFP
- Expanded academic program offerings
 - Transition to Tier I curriculum
 - Expansion of Career and Technical Education
 - 1:1 Student Devices



- Significant reinvestment in capital projects within existing budget
- Existing budget cannot afford employee raises or improvements to athletic facilities and tracks



Commitment to our Students

St. Landry Parish School System is committed to building the future of our children by promoting lifelong learning and by providing opportunities for college and career readiness for all students.

We Need Your Support

SLP provides federal funding via Title I-V averaging about \$370k per year to Non-Public/Parochial Schools within the district as well as providing some transportation resources. Supporting this increase will support our Non-Public schools as well.

Local Charter Schools receive \$1.5 million per year. If the millage passes, charter schools will receive additional MFP funding.

The LDOE will support the district's efforts if proposals are passed by providing additional MFP funding annually.

This will help to improve our bond rating.



Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is the proposal?

A: St. Landry Parish Communities will be asked to consider two separate bond proposals that will be used to increase teacher and supporting staff salaries within the St. Landry Parish School System and to fund athletic facility improvements (tracks) at each of six high schools. Proposed Salary Increase - Teachers (\$3,000); Support Personnel (\$2,000)

- Q: When will the election for this proposition occur?
 - A: November 13, 2021 or March 26, 2022
- Q: What happens if one proposal fails?

A: The proposals are not tied together. If one fails, and the other passes, then the millage for the one that passes will be assessed and the other millage will not be assessed.

- ◆ Q: Why does the school district need additional funding?
 - A: Most of the high schools' tracks in St. Landry Parish are in dire need of upgrades. Additional funding will allow us to fund new tracks at each of the six high schools in our district. The funds from the 1st proposition will increase all employee salaries, making the district more attractive to prospective employees. The salary increases will also be competitive with surrounding parishes.
