AFFIDAVIT

The undersigned, of lawful age, being first duly sworn, upon oath deposes and states as follows:

1. He is a Tulsa Police Officer.
2. He has read certain official investigative reports and statements of witnesses regarding the above named Defendant(s) and has personal knowledge of the incident and from these statements, reports and knowledge it appears as follows:
3. On July 27, 2026, at approximately 0624 hours Miranda Louise Chase, defendant, was operating a 2017 Nissan Altima, OK tag IMB-432, traveling east in the 2200 block of East 36th Street North, in the city of Tulsa, Tulsa County. The defendant drove her Nissan into the rear of Kenneth Garcia Young as he drove his motorized Merits wheelchair East-Bound on East 36th Street North in the East-Bound Lane, 3-4 feet North from the South White Fog Line. Young was crashed off the roadway and landed face down in the South ditch over 38 feet from the Point of Impact. Chase hit her brake on impact and left 24 feet of tire skid, before letting off the brake and continuing to roll East. 44 feet from the end of the brake skid there is Acceleration tread for 50 feet East towards North Lewis Avenue. Chase never stopped to see what she had crashed into or if anything had been damaged besides her driven vehicle.

A citizen located Young and did C.P.R. on him until he was transported to St. John Medical center by EMSA. Young was pronounced deceased at 07:07 hours from his injuries in this crash.

Several vehicle parks were broken off and left at the scene. Possible critical pieces were turned into evidence.

Mackenzie Hale, co-habitant of Chase (2208 W. Louisville St., Broken Arrow, Oklahoma 74012) called the police after she had seen on media news story about this hit and run case and the limited information about the suspect vehicle. Hale said Chase had told her that someone hit her car. Hale told Police Chase was agitated and did not want to talk about her car. Hale said Chase's front end wrecked car matched the suspect car mentioned on media, and Chase was acting nervous about the crash. Hale notified Lieutenant Dennis Smith of the Tulsa Police Department Gilcrease Traffic Unit. The Tulsa Police Gilcrease Traffic Unit and Broken Arrow Police Department then went to 2208 W. Louisville Street in Broken Arrow Oklahoma. Lieutenant Dennis Smith authored a search warrant for listed address.

A Search Warrant was signed by Tulsa County Special District Judge Deborah Ludi Leitch and executed by the Tulsa Police Department at 2208 W. Louisville St., Broken Arrow, Oklahoma 74012.

A Gray 2017 Nissan Altima, Oklahoma Tag IMB-432 Expired Feb. 2026, V.I.N.: 1N4AL3AP5HC236801, was parked inside the garage at 2208 W. Louisville St., Broken Arrow, Oklahoma 74012. The front and front quarter panel of the car had been removed, and the pieces were missing from this residence.

Chase said a friend named "John" had removed the bumper. When questioned about if "John" was her son, because it was reported that her son was the one taking apart the car, she said No, her son's name is Dylan Riley Chase, and he had removed the car parts and was fixing the car for her. Chase said her son had taken the car parts to his residence that she did not know the address (later found to be 20657 E. 31st Pl., Broken Arrow, Oklahoma 74012).

Dylan Chase was called and approximately 3 hours later returned the call. Dylan then allowed the Tulsa Police Department to come to his residence, and he gave the removed car parts to the officer. The front bumper had been sawed into 3 sections.

On July 28, 2026, Officer S. Parrish and Officer B. Paul were able to examine the crime scene car part evidence and piece the gray bumper piece and head light pieces at the scene to the recovered bumper and headlight assembly from Dylan's residence together, showing that there were 3 pieces that fit back together from being broken off when the vehicle crashed at 2200 E. 36th St. North, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Miranda Louise Chase, defendant, was operating a motor vehicle, a 2017 Nissan Altima, in Tulsa County. She was involved in a collision which caused the death of Kenneth Garcia Young.

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The defendant's local and NCIC records, along with his driving history are attached. The defendant is: Miranda Louise Chase, w/f 11201980, 5'0", 250 pounds, brown hair and brown eyes. Soc. Sec. 7718, Oklahoma D/L L082424610. ADDRESS: 2208 W Louisville Street, Broken Arrow, OK 74012

WHEREFORE, affiant prays this Honorable Court to issue a warrant for the arrest of the within named Defendant(s), that they may be brought before a magistrate and held to answer for the offense(s) of: **Leaving the Scene of a Serious Injury/ Fatal Crash, Obstruction, and Expired Tag** .

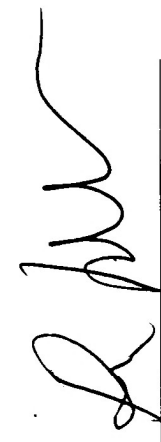
requesting that a warrant be issued for the within named Defendant(s), that they might be arrested and held to answer for the offense(s) of:
