SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF INVESTIGATION

**FINDINGS OF THE TWENTY-FIRST MULTICOUNTY GRAND JURY
REGARDING THE OKLAHOMA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS
ELECTRONIC MONITORING PROGRAM**

June 11, 2026¹

¹ It is the request of the Twenty-First Multicounty Grand Jury that this Supplemental Report of Investigation be sealed until after the Oklahoma primary election on June 16, 2026.

On May 7, 2026, the Twenty-First Multicounty Grand Jury of the State of Oklahoma released its findings regarding the Oklahoma Department of Corrections Electronic Monitoring Program (GPS Program). Contained in that report are our findings regarding the case of Sara Polston and Governor Kevin Stitt's involvement. Subsequent to submitting those findings, the Multicounty Grand Jury received additional evidence relevant to Sara Polston's placement on the GPS Program in the form of Rod Polston's call log records.²

Though this new information does not prove any criminal wrongdoing on the part of Governor Stitt, we, the Multicounty County Grand Jury, believe the public should be aware of the new information due to (1) the coincidental and circumstantial aspect of the timing of the calls and relevant events related to this case and (2) the fact that this information would undeniably have been included in our initial report had it been available at the time. We believe that the public has the right to know all the pertinent evidence obtained in any case in order to arrive at the most informed personal opinions possible. Therefore, the Twenty-First Multicounty Grand Jury of Oklahoma submits to this Honorable Court and to the People of the State of Oklahoma the following Supplemental Report of Investigation.

This Grand Jury received Rod Polston's call log records from April of 2025 to April of 2026.³ Out of 6,950 calls, review of these records revealed 16 phone calls between Rod Polston and Governor Kevin Stitt. Starting in April of 2025, phone records showed zero calls between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt until after Sara Polston pled guilty to Causing an Accident Resulting in Great Bodily Injury While Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol with a Blood Alcohol Content of 0.15 or Higher. All of the 16 calls in question were made from Governor Stitt to Rod Polston.⁴

The first call between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt occurred on November 7, 2025, and lasted over six minutes. Relevant to the timing of this first phone call is DOC's initial attempts to contact Sara Polston for her pre-sentence investigation

report (PSI).⁵ The DOC officer assigned to conduct the PSI first attempted to contact Sara Polston on October 28, 2025, and left a voicemail. That officer again attempted to contact Sara Polston on November 6, 2025, and left a voicemail.

The DOC officer conducting the PSI finally contacted Sara Polston on November 10, 2025. A phone call occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt on November 11, 2025, lasting over six minutes.

On December 5, 2025, Sara Polston was sentenced to a 15-year sentence with the first 8 years to be spent in the custody of DOC and was remanded to the custody of the Cleveland County Sheriff. On December 6, 2025, two phone calls occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt, one at 2:39 PM lasting just under eight minutes and the other at 2:56 PM lasting just under five minutes. Later that day, Rod Polston informed his wife on Cleveland County Jail calls that he talked to “The Guy” and discussed pardon and parole. Rod Polston went on to say that “The Guy” and the head of DOC are working on getting Sara Polston moved out of the Cleveland County Jail.

On December 8, 2025, at 8:23 AM, a phone call occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt lasting just over six minutes. On Cleveland County jail calls between 8:36 AM and 8:48 AM, Rod Polston informed his wife that he was just on the phone with “Our Friend,” that “Our Buddy” is going to do everything he can, and that “Kevin” is going to give an update in an hour and a half. Around an hour and a half later, at 10:00 AM, another call occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt lasting just under two minutes. At 10:34 AM, Rod Polston informed his wife that she was being moved that day from jail to a DOC facility and that the State “pushed it from the top.” At 1:24 PM, DOC officers privately transported Sara Polston to Mabel Bassett Correctional Center for assessment and reception.⁶

On December 9, 2025, Sara Polston was transferred from Mabel Bassett to Dr. Eddie Warrior Correctional Center. At 1:26 PM that day on a DOC phone call, Sara Polston told her husband to “push on your end.” On December 10, 2025, a phone call occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt lasting just over seven

minutes. Per DOC records, Sara Polston was flagged as eligible for the GPS Program on December 11, 2025.

On February 5th, 6th, and 9th of 2026, phone calls occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt lasting over fourteen minutes, over eleven minutes, and over four minutes respectively. On February 10, 2026, DOC's Administrative Programs Officer began to review Sara Polston's GPS application.

On February 11, 2026, at 1:17 PM, a phone call occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt lasting just under five minutes. At 3:16 PM, Sara Polston was approved for the GPS Program.


On February 13, 2026, a phone call occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt lasting over eight minutes. On a February 14, 2026 DOC phone call between Sara Polston and her mother, Sara Polston stated that her GPS release was not surprising and that it had "been in the works for a while."

On February 17, 2026, at 9:26 AM, a phone call occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt lasting over two minutes. At 9:30 AM on a DOC phone call, Sara Polston asked her husband who he had been on the phone with, to which Rod Polston responded, "somebody." That same day, Sara Polston was placed in a segregated housing unit at Eddie Warrior Correctional Center.

On February 19, 2026, Sara Polston went home. A final call occurred between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt on February 25, 2026, lasting just under twenty minutes. Phone records showed no subsequent calls between Rod Polston and Governor Stitt.

We, the Twenty-First Multicounty Grand Jury, believe this evidence corroborates our previously reported findings and deepens our concerns regarding DOC's GPS Program and political favoritism surrounding Sara Polston's transfer into that program.


