DESCRIBE WHAT HAPPENED:				0/14/12 0030			
Complainant, Mr. Raymond Pack, called police and stated that officers had conducted a home invasion on his residence on 08/14/12.  Complainant stated that officers handcuffed and physically assaulted him. He also claimed that officers broke the door to his residence and damaged his pistol.							
On 08/14/12, officers located the vehicle taken in a robbery/carjacking parked in front of 1243 Sunnymeade Dr. K-9 units responded to the scene and attempted a track, but advised that the dogs never picked up a scent. K-9 advised they scanned the area in the attempt. Officers located a cell phone taken in the robbery in a trash can on the sidewalk, which was between the stolen vehicle and the complainant's residence. Officers spoke with neighbors who had come outside to see what was going on. Officers advised the description of the robbery suspects (2 M/W, 18-22 years old) and neighbor stated that 2 teenage M/W subjects lived at 1239 Sunnymeade Dr. Officers conducted a knock and talk at this residence. Officer Coon advised that the complainant (Mr. Pack) opened the door and pointed a pistol at him. Officer Coon stated that he drew his weapon and attempted to sidestep the complainant while giving commands to drop the pistol. Officer Coon stated that the complainant then took a step out of the residence towards him while continuing to point a pistol at him. Multiple officers were pointing their weapons at the complainant and giving him commands to drop the gun. The complainant lowered his weapon, backed back into his residence and laid the gun on a table. Officer Coon grabbed the subject and pulled him out of the residence, where he was handcuffed. Officer Tomes held the door when the subject was handcuffed then began to conduct a protective sweep of the residence with Officer Coon. Officer Ruiz took custody of the complainant and moved him away from the residence. The protective sweep occurred immediately after the complainant was handcuffed. Officer Coon called me (Sgt Pierpoint) and informed me what had occurred once the protective sweep was completed. Once the situation had calmed, officers spoke with the complainant and explained their actions. Officers had initially detained the complainant for arrest due to the aggravated assault on Officer Coon. However, they decided not to follow through on the arrest on
