i an writing to you on behalf of Survivor Activists of Domestic Violence which I am the founding member of and as a very active lifelong Catholic in the Diocese of Buffalo. As the list of credibly accused priests kept growing I kept finding one after another on the list that I knew very well. Many of them were very involved in Youth Ministry like I was. I was on the original DYRT (Diocese Youth Retreat Team) and served as the Youth Minister for my parish when we were joined by another parish during the consolidations that happened during the Journey of Faith and Grace that was implemented by then Bishop Kmiec. I attended Catholic School from Kindergarten to 6th grade and then was homeschooled and joined the Children of Mary Homeschoolers and Soldiers of Christ Youth Group which is where I first met Sjobhan O'Connor. As soon as I learned to read I started to read at mass and as soon as I got into 4th grade and found out that girls were allowed to be altar servers, I signed up. I have sang and played my keyboard in various music ministries throughout the diocese and have been involved in one way or another in various ministries. I started teaching Religious Education when I was 17 and first attended the Protecting God's Children Seminar and began reading the bulletins. I spent several years volunteering with the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul while I was discerning a religious vocation with them. I taught RCIA and High School Religious Education in my 20s. I took the retreat minister training and a few continuing education courses at Christ the King Seminary (then finished my studies online through a different program as I had gotten married and started my family by that point.) I'm not trying to boast of my involvement. I just want you to know that I have spent my life devoted to our diocese and Catholic church. I'm sure you or at least Kathy Spangler have seen my many posts on facebook and twitter regarding my thoughts about the dark times we are currently facing in our diocese. This comes from a place of love for our church especially our wonderful diocese. As a Survivor of Domestic Violence, all kinds of abuse, and Sexual harassment, assault, and marital rape, I unfortunetly understand all too well what it is like to be a victim. Although I did not have that done by a member of the clergy, I still empathize with the victims and feel justice and healing is our common goal. The majority want you to step down. There are various reasons why. For one, You are what is called a trigger for the victims. A trigger is someone or something that causes feelings usually negative ones like sadness and anger; often PTSD flashbacks. Seeing you and hearing you refuse to step down upsets people. Also we all know that you were aware of these things and did not handle them properly. You keep saying things that are contrary to the proof that has been provided. The media is not the enemy. Charlie and others are devout Catholics and want the best for our diocese. The only way to move forward is to move on without you. We urge you to do the right thing and step down.

I have another concern that needs to be addressed at the diocese and the pastoral level. There isn't anything being done for the victims aside from monetarily. I strongly suggest and would offer to help if needed to provide trauma informed ministry. There are many victims of all kinds of abuse that turn to their parish for help and are often re-victimized by victim blaming and what is referred to as clerical abuse. What that is basically is using biblical quotes such as those about women being submissive to their husbands to imply that women should stay in abusive marriages and not seek out help. I know that Catholic Charities offers counseling services but more is needed as far as pastorally/spiritually. The NY State Office for the Prevention of Domestic Violence, the Governor's Office of Faith Based Community Development Services, IN cooperation with the New York Theological Seminary has a free publication called "Domestic Violence and Faith Communities: Guidelines for Leaders." It's a good resource to start with. I just thought while I was addressing one matter I would address this as well. This is the 2nd time I have emailed a bishop. The first time was my concerns about Youth Ministry back when I was a teenager and I was invited to the Catholic Center to meet with the Youth Department.

I have been praying for you and for Our Diocese and the various ministries here and will continue to do so. Those of us asking for you to submit your resignation are doing so out of love for our Church and feel that is in the best interest and best possible solution to start to move forward.

I have been a member of SS Peter and Paul in Hamburg my entire life. I attended grammar school there, Immaculata Academy for high school, and St. Bonaventure University for undergrad.

My faith has always been an integral part of my life.

Over the past year, my faith has been severely tested. I made the decision to stop attending mass in February. It broke my heart, but the thought of encouraging my four children to take part in something that their mother didn't fully embrace made my decision a no-brainer.

When the sex abuse scandals began to break, I saw preists I grew up knowing, including the priest who married my husband and I, and gave my beloved grandmother her last rites.

The day the news broke about the repulsive behavior of Fr. Art and Fr. Pat, the nail was driven deep into the coffin. My 13-year-old son read the reports of what these men said, and the fallout from that night. How could I ever respect these men, let alone expect my children to do the same?

You allowed them to return to ministry as if nothing had happened. They are both present in the elementary school (which I removed my children from in 2016), and carry on as if nothing happened. THIS IS NOT OK.

I am sure you are a decent human being and believe you can fix this-- but you can't. The damage is done. You are a lightening rod for negative attention and continue to make the state of our diocese worse as the days pass. We cannot move forward and rebuild if you remain leader. Please do the right thing for the flock. We need a new shepherd. It is time.

I returned to mass yesterday for the first time in months. It was the unwavering faith of those who have been severely impacted by this scandal that brought me back. My four children and I attended mass at St. Francis in Athol Springs. We were greeted at the door and welcomed in. Several parishioners spoke to us before and after mass, making us feel as though we were already a part of their community. THIS is what the Catholic faith is about--and our diocese deserves better.

I am an active parishioner of St. Joseph University Parish, as well as the Chairperson of the SJUP Refugee and Immigration Committee. As you may recall, approximately one year ago, I wrote to you advising that I would not be paying the remaining \$7,500 of the \$10,000 pledge I made to the Upon This Rock campaign. 



Dear Mr. Malone:

Mr. Malone, it's time for you to step down.

The media coverage journalizing your denial and embodiment of the clergy sexual abuse crisis in the Buffalo Roman Catholic Diocese has made you and the diocese the laughing stock of the world at this point. Since published history indicated that you were serving as an administrator of the Boston Diocese at the time of the clergy sexual abuse scandal, one would think you would have learned something from that and would have made the proper plans, moves, choices, and said the right things to significantly reduce or eliminate further risks to innocent and vulnerable parishioners and community members. To date, you have said nothing other than made vague statements as well as enabled and abet sexual offenses that your minions in the cloth here in the Buffalo area have caused. Because of that, those who live and worship in these parishes are no longer safe, and in a significant number of instances like mine, we have turned away from participating in the Holy Mass and the Sacraments as well as stopped participating in parish activities and giving offertory funds to those parishes.

As a human service worker specializing in the supervision and behavioral health treatment of sexual offenders, I've met with and attempted to provide client-centered treatment of those who were adjudicated and/or convicted of such offenses among youth and other vulnerable populations. Research strongly indicates that the recidivism rate among sexual offenders is about 95%, while those who are enabled and unexposed to consequences rank among the greatest number of those who reoffend. Given published reports and from your statements in these press conferences, it's been made exceedingly clear that you have refused to take anything away from the scandal in Boston and have continued to aid and abet sexual offenders by reappointing suspended clergy offenders and placing them in different parishes well knowing of their history and danger to the communities they're serving. INSTEAD OF REPORTING THESE VIOLATORS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT, THESE VIOLATORS HAVE BEEN SENT TO "TREATMENT", AND AFTER THIS "TREATMENT" THEY HAVE BEEN REASSIGNED TO PARISHES TO POSSIBLY REOFFEND AMONG OTHER VULNERABLE AND YOUTHFUL MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITIES THAT YOU SEND THEM TO SERVE AT.

As a student and alumni of a Catholic grade school, high school and college, I was trained to provide utmost respect, obedience and subservice for those in religious vocations. I also was trained and until this scandal obey the Ten Commandments and worship God and Jesus Christ and their representatives in the cloth who are the teachers and preachers of the Liturgy. I also was well aware that there are some members of the religious who I questioned as good shepherds and representatives of those of us they were entrusted with. Currently I have lost all respect for those in religious vocations as it seems there are way too many who have no empathy or care for us, and that the thousands upon thousands of dollars of tuition money invested into what I thought was an incredible Catholic education through my Master's Degree and beyond was a total waste.

Your most recent press conferences have clearly indicated that you are perpetuating a dangerous situation here in the Western New York area. You have made it quite obvious that your narcissistic and anti-social behavior during these press conferences warrants close scrutiny by your superiors here in the United States and the Vatican, and if indicated by local, state, and federal laws (not Canon Law, which is a joke) that you should be taken into custody by law enforcement and brought up on charges of conspiracy of sexual abuse.




