#### **Order of Release**

#### **Defendant has been found not guilty.**

Defendant has been found not guilty. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the defendant be released own recognizance from custody in this Case Number CR2023-120528-001 only.

### **RELEASE CONDITIONS**

1. Go to all court hearings. Missing court can result in an arrest warrant, being taken back into custody, no bond or a higher bond. The court may also hold the hearing in your absence.
2. You must return to the police department that arrested you and have them 10-Print fingerprint you. If you are released from custody you must complete this before your next hearing. You must bring proof of your fingerprinting to your next hearing or your release may be revoked.
3. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:  
Pursuant to ARS §13-610 and Rule 4.2(9) of the Arizona Rules of Criminal Procedure, that the arresting agency shall secure a DNA sample as required by ARS §13-610 §§ (k) and (g) for every person scheduled for this Criminal Court calendar that was arrested for any charge specified by ARS 913-610(0) and provide compliance to the Superior Court.

### **General Conditions**

- You must appear at all court proceedings. Missing court may result in a warrant for your arrest, losing your release conditions, and the court holding the hearing in your absence.
- You must maintain contact with your attorney.
- You must appear for Sentencing if you are convicted. If your absence delays sentencing for more than 90 days, you may lose your right to a direct appeal unless you prove that your absence was involuntary by clear and convincing evidence.
- Failure to appear at a future court proceeding may result in waiving any claim that you were not informed of a plea offer made by the State. Not appearing may also result in a separate charge of "Failure to Appear," punishable by jail (in addition to penalties for your current charge).
- Do not commit any criminal offenses. If you are released on a felony charge, and the court finds you committed a new felony during the period of release, the court must revoke your release.
- Do not leave the state without permission of the court.

If you violate any of these General Conditions, the court may issue a warrant for your arrest, revoke your release, forfeit the bond and security deposit, increase the bond, modify the conditions of release, find you in contempt of court and sentence you to imprisonment, a fine, or both.
